Any resident can use the **ERYC online LINK** to report a pothole or issues with roads, footpaths or kerbs, private road adoption, road resurfacing issues and schedules.

The more reports, the quicker the repairs (subject to available funding):

Select "Can I report an issue with a road, footpath or kerb?"

Where the issue is located i.e., "Road" or "Footpath" and "Pothole" then follow the prompts which establish as near as can where the pothole is. Log in/register and fill in the online form with as much detail as possible.

If the issue is dangerous to pedestrians or road users, as this is an emergency issue outside of office hours, please report it immediately to (01482) 393939.

Please note that reporting engine 'Fix My Street' is no longer recognised by ERYC.

Fraud Alert

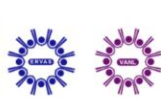
We have been informed by Humberside Police that fraudsters are impersonating Police Officers (claiming to be from Grimsby Police Station). They have contacted elderly people in an attempt to steal money from them. The fraudsters are suggesting that bank accounts have been compromised or that the victim has been given fake bank notes. One fraudster told the victim to call 101 whilst they were still on the phone to confirm who they are.

Marie Josephine Whellan (by Harold Wood)

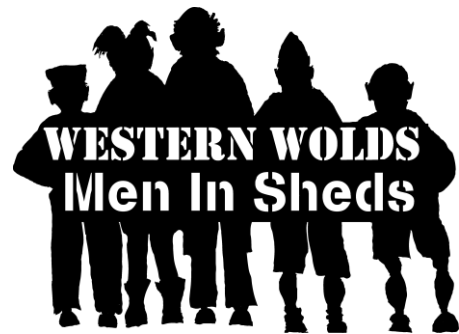
Marie was born in West Derby, Liverpool in 1909 to Henrici Harrison Whellan and Catherinnae (nee Hughes).

She joined 76 Squadron in communications on 5th September 1944 and was stationed at Holme on Spalding Moor. In her free - time she played the piano for sing songs at the Blacksmith's Arms in the village. She met and married my Uncle Norman Wood in 1946, one of 6 brothers from the village. They lived in an area called 'The Prefabs' on Springfield.

They went on to have a daughter Catherine Margaret Wood.

After the war ended, they moved to Liverpool, often returning to the village for visits to family and friends. She died in 1990 in Knowsley, Liverpool.





We at the shed can hardly believe it's Christmas just round the corner. So, when this edition of Grapevine is published it covers the Christmas period.

We have been so busy creating the new workspaces and fitting them out to suit members.

We were very fortunate to obtain a grant for new tools and a dust extraction system from the wind farm. This was enabled by East Yorkshire Council.

The noise level is now under control, we have moved most of the noisy machines into a dedicated machine shop leaving the main woodworking area reasonably quiet.

The Christmas lunch venue was The Black Horse Pub at Seaton Ross, but unfortunately, they have closed for the winter.

An alternative venue was sought, and we are pleased to report The Feathers in Pocklington has been chosen and it can accommodate all our 40 plus members.

Invitations have also gone out to past members who may wish to join us.

There have been requests for mini libraries from a couple of villages, as well as an extension for an existing library to create a separate children's library.

We are looking forward to a wonderful Christmas and wish everybody all the best for the New Year.

Safeguarding Guidance: Children and Young People

This article has been submitted by Councillor Victoria Aitken, Portfolio Holder for Children, Families & Education and as requested it is being shared with you.

Please see below some very useful information, which provides guidance about sharing concerns relating to safeguarding children and young people. It is important that we all remember that it takes a community to raise a child and I know here in the East Riding we all want the very best environment for all of our East Riding Children and Young People. **This information can be shared with residents:**

What should I do if I am worried about a child or young person?

If you are ever concerned that a child is in immediate danger, please call the police on 999.

Safeguarding children and young people are the responsibility of everyone. If you are a professional, young person, carer, family member or a member of the public and you are worried about a child or young person, who has or may be likely to suffer significant harm, you can contact the Safeguarding and Partnership Hub (SaPH), the front door to Children's Social Care.

Members of the Public

*If you are a young person, family member, carer, or member of the public and you want to discuss a child that you are worried about, or make a self-referral you can contact the Safeguarding and Partnership Hub (SaPH) during office hours on: **(01482) 395500 - Choose 'Option 1'** and a social worker will be able to talk through your worries with you and discuss what happens next.*

Outside of office hours: Children's Emergency Duty Team (CEDT):

If you have a worry about a child outside of office hours, the Children's Emergency duty Team (CEDT) operates to respond to emergency situations from 5pm until 8:30am Monday to Thursday and 4.30pm until 8:30am on a Friday and at weekends and bank holidays. CEDT responds to emergency situations that are unable to wait until the next working day.

These will relate to children's safeguarding, potential placement, or family breakdowns and any other Children's Services statutory work. Your call will be taken by a Lifeline operator.

The social worker will then make the decision if an intervention/additional information is needed that evening, or the situation can wait until the following morning when a children's social work team or the Safeguarding and Partnership Hub (SaPH) will follow-up with the person sharing the information the following day.

The sooner our staff have information about any concern the sooner a situation can be addressed. All conversations are in the strictest of confidence, so call as soon as possible rather than wish you had.

East Riding Household Support Fund for Oil Customers

Humber and Wolds Rural Action are administering the Household Support Fund for Oil Customers this winter, with it being aimed at low-income households within the East Riding area.

We are looking to target eligible households who use oil for heating, and we thought that circulating to Parish Councils could help get the information out to residents who could benefit from this scheme.

Below you can find a link to the website which includes full details, eligibility criteria and the application form.

The Household Support Fund aims to help vulnerable households in the East Riding with the rising cost of heating oil. Grants will be awarded to eligible residents and is aimed at low-income households.

Please note that this fund is only available to East Riding residents.

On application if eligible, households will receive an oil delivery or the LPG alternative and free membership to the Bulk Oil Buying Scheme for the first year (normally £20 per year).

HOUSEHOLD SUPPORT FUND
(information supplied by Neighbourhood Watch)

The Household Support Fund is provided by the Department for Work and Pensions to support those most in need. This fund can be used to help households with children, households with pensioners and other households, with the cost of: -

- Food
- Energy and water bills
- Essentials linked to energy and water.
- Wider essentials, where appropriate, such as housing costs and other essential bills

Monies from the fund can be used to help different people on low incomes, depending on their eligibility.

You are eligible to make an application for support if:

- You are working, but not in receipt of any benefits.
- You are an unpaid adult carer. You must not have received, or be eligible for, the £900 cost of living payment, and the person you care for must be in receipt of a disability payment.
- Your income is below £26,000 per year for single households and under £31,000 per year for other households.
- You have under £6,000 in savings or in a bank account.

Please note by applying for this funding, you are allowing this information to be passed to our carers' service. They will contact you, to make sure you are registered within the East Riding as a carer and will offer further support.

SAFE AND SOUND GRANT

You can now have video doorbells fitted through the Safe & Sound Grant. The grant is open to anyone that:

- Is aged sixty (or over) or disabled.
- Is not a tenant of East Riding of Yorkshire Council (though if you are a tenant of ERYC then you can apply for a separate fund through your Housing Officer)
- Does not have combined household savings of more than £23,250.
- Has not successfully applied for the Safe & Sound grant in the previous two years.

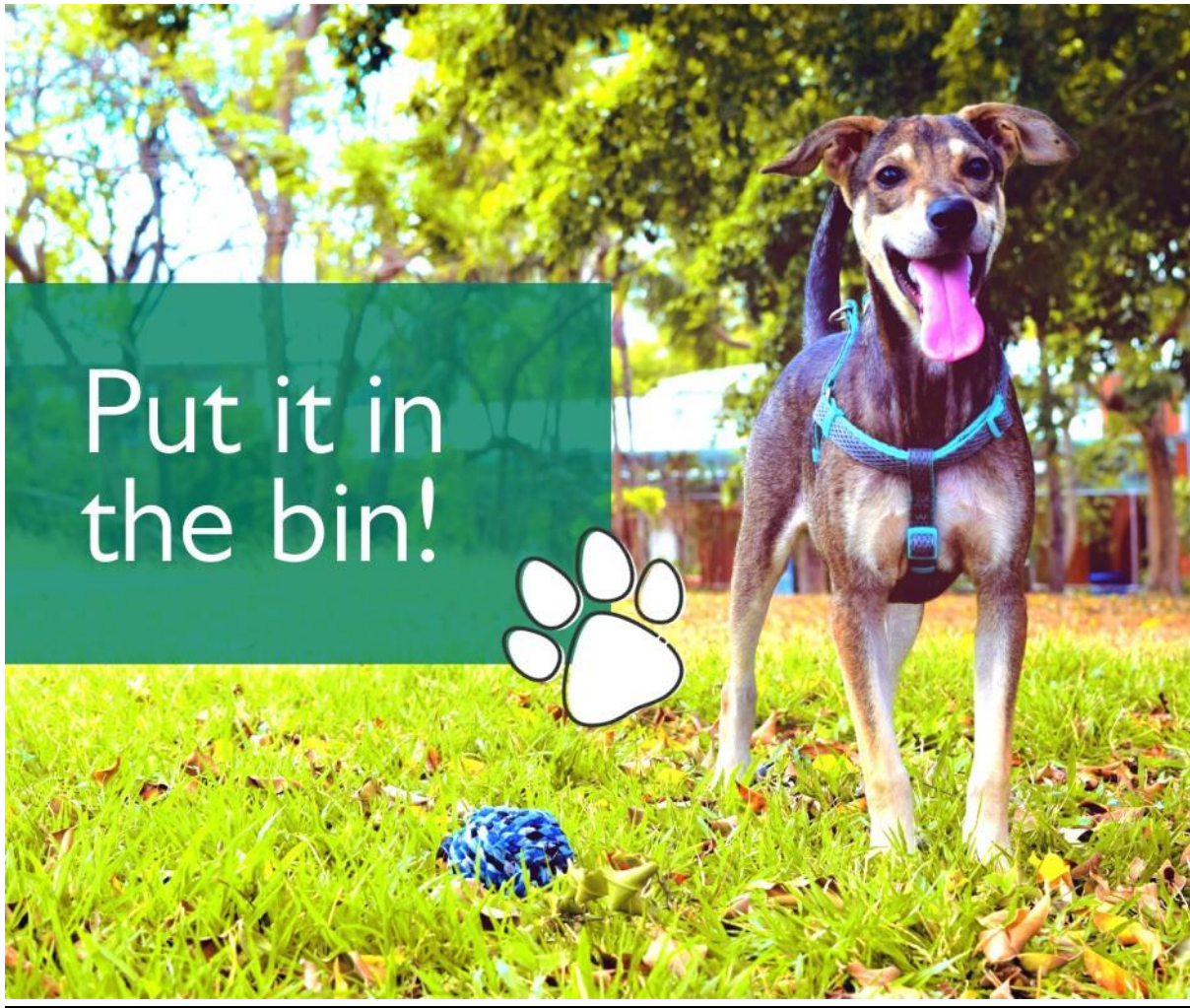
My Community Alert (MCA)
