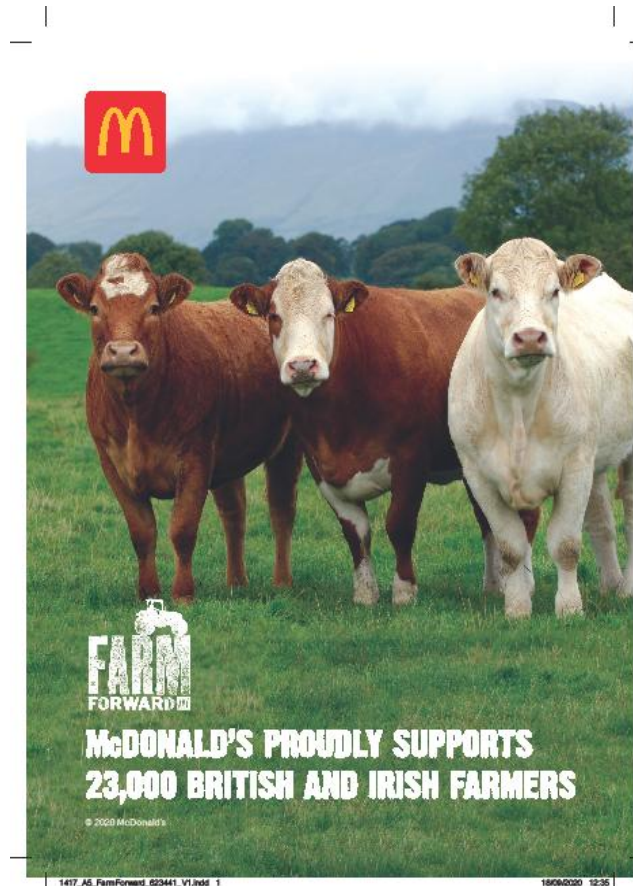

The team will be targeting those who chose to commit crime within our rural communities.

The Inspector leading the Rural Task Force is Neighbourhood Police **#InspJonPowell**, he said, "Over the years Humberside Police have worked tirelessly to tackle rural crime and help to make our rural communities feel safer. This new team will focus on disruption of criminal activities, apprehension, arrest, charging and prosecution of offenders."

CLERK'S NOTES

As Clerk I am generally the first point of contact for residents and East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) for all matters to do with Holme on Spalding Parish Council.

Parish Council Meetings

Parish Council Meetings are held on the third Wednesday of the month and start at 7.00pm. At the moment because of the COVID situation they are held using Zoom and future dates for all 2021 meetings are detailed on the Parish Council Website <https://www.hosmparishcouncil.co.uk/> The agendas for meeting are published on the Wednesday prior to the meeting. Following the monthly meeting the minutes are produced by the Clerk. These minutes are then agreed as a true record by the Councillors at the next Parish Council Meeting before being published.

The meetings are open to the public and if you would like to attend or speak in the public session please contact the clerk, at least 3 working days before the meeting and I will send you the Zoom link to take part.

Planning Applications

All Planning Applications that fall within the Parish of Holme on Spalding Moor are sent to the Parish Council for comment by the Planning Department at ERYC. There is no legal requirement for ERYC to do this; they do it because they understand that local knowledge may raise issues about an application that they may otherwise be unaware of. The Parish Council only receives brief details of each application, including the application number, the proposal, the location, and the name of the applicant. All other details including drawings and maps for applications are held on the Planning Portal at ERYC <https://newplanningaccess.eastriding.gov.uk/newplanningaccess>. Please note that occasionally a planning application is received after an agenda has been produced but before the next Parish Council Meeting where it will be discussed.

If you have a specific interest in a planning matter or believe that a Planning Application has been submitted that may directly impact you, please look at the Planning Portal. Following review of Planning Applications, the Parish Council's comments are uploaded to the Planning Portal where they can be accessed. Planning Applications are then subjected to the process of scrutiny by all interested parties including environmental health, drainage, water and Highways. The Parish Council is not informed of any changes made to an application after the Parish Council has commented. This is why it is important that all interested parties in an application follow its progress through the system at ERYC. Once an application has been approved at ERYC the decision can only be challenged by the applicant. The only time it could be challenged is if information comes to light after planning has been approved which challenges the decision.

Reporting Problems

If you have an issue that you wish to report the quickest way to get it actioned is to report it yourself to the relevant department at ERYC. There are a number of reasons for this but mainly it is much quicker, and residents can provide additional details about the problem which I, as Clerk, cannot provide. Residents can also keep an eye on any repair work after they have raised an issue and ensure that it has been actioned.

To raise a report please visit www.eastriding.gov or telephone 01482 393939. On the website there is a drop-down menu covering all those areas that ERYC are responsible for including:

Trees, hedges and grass cutting.

Road and footpath maintenance (including potholes, damaged kerbs)

Production and maintenance of road signs.

Street Lighting.

Flooding and drainage issues

Fly tipping.

Before reporting an issue, please ensure that you have as much information as possible e.g. if it's a streetlight the number on the lamppost and the name of the road. Any photographs you can add to should be also very useful especially for potholes, overhanging branches or flooding issues because it gives the council an idea of the extent of the problem. When you have made a report, you will receive a unique ID number. Please make a record of this so that it can be quoted if you need to follow up an issue.

If you feel that your query has not been handled properly or action has not been taken to rectify the problem, please contact me quoting the ID number and I will follow it up on your behalf.

Parish Council Cemetery

The Parish Council Cemetery is situated adjacent to the main graveyard at All Saints Church, Market Weighton Road. The Cemetery is owned on behalf of the Parish by the Parish Council and is administered by the Parish Clerk. The Clerk is the initial point of contact for all matters relating to the Cemetery; in her absence the Chairman of the Parish Council, Helen Williamson, can also be contacted (see councillor's lists for details). If you have any queries relating to the Cemetery or wish to reserve a plot please contact the Clerk for further information.

In addition to those areas detailed above the Parish Council is also responsible for the following:-

Defibrillators

The Parish Council purchased and maintain 2 defibrillators in the village which are sited on the external wall at the entrance to the Village Hall, High Street and the external wall at Margaret's DIY shop, Runner End. If you have a medical emergency and need to use a machine, please dial 999. The operator will give you the access code to open the box and access the equipment. If you need to use the machine, please can you contact the Clerk because the pads are single use only and will need to be replaced.

Dog Waste Bag Dispensers and Litter Bins

There are sufficient litter bins and dog waste bag dispensers located around the village to meet dog owner's needs. The dog waste bags are for use in an emergency but in the past, it would appear they have been used as a free supply of bags. To reduce costs the dispensers are now refilled less often and with fewer bags. Please could dog owners use their own dog waste bags and only use those in the dispensers in an emergency.

Dear Residents

The year is marching on; we are at last seeing signs of spring and the very positive rollout of the C-19 vaccination program. Please hang in there, the end is in sight, stay within the boundaries given to us by central government, **“wear a mask, keep your distance and wash hands”**, **“Do it for Holme on Spalding Moor”**.

Last month an additional £200k Community pot was announced to give grant funding to Town and Parish Councils, Voluntary and Community Sector organisations and others to offer seed money to hold events & festivals, organise COVID recovery community activity and extend access to services, all intended to encourage residents back onto high streets and to utilise arts, cultural and community facilities. So get your thinking caps on and see how you can get involved in community events within the Parish or wider area. Details will be available very soon.

In HOSM, planning applications are once again high on the agenda. We do seem to be having more than our fair share of applications. Many are outside the proposed allocated land shown in the ERYC local plan. Developers obviously realise what a great place Holme is but we do need to ensure this lovely village isn't spoilt by over development. We can't control who, where or how often applications come forward but remember you can make your comments known via this link <https://www.eastriding.gov.uk/planning-permission-and-building-control/applications-for-planning-and-building-control/view-and-comment-on-planning-applications/> and it's important to make your feelings known each time an application is received.

Many of you are doing a fantastic job volunteering at the various vaccination centres, and many are still supporting the vulnerable in our community with shopping, food banks and general community support, THANK YOU, I look forward to meeting up with many of you again when we are out and about later this year.

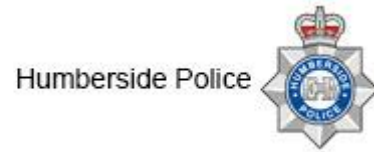

Catalytic Converter Thefts - Tips on How To Protect Your Vehicle

Today we're warning motorists to be on their guard following a number of reports of catalytic converters being stolen.

In the last month we have received reports of incidents in Goole, Scunthorpe, Brigg and Grimsby and work is ongoing to identify the people responsible.

Inspector Dave Stephenson said: "As the price of metals such as platinum and palladium have risen, many areas of the UK have seen increased reports of catalytic converters being stolen.

"While all cars are potentially at risk, thieves are most likely to target hybrids – where the catalytic converter is used less and the metals are less likely to be damaged – or vehicles with a higher ground clearance, such as vans and SUVs.

"We're investigating all the reports we have received and are following up a number of lines of enquiry.

"In the meantime, we want to help prevent further thefts from occurring, so please pass on our advice to anyone you think may be at risk and, if you see anyone acting suspiciously, please call us on our non-emergency 101 line."

Among the steps you can take to protect your vehicle are:

- Speak to your local garage about having suitable locks or guards fitted. They can also advise you on getting your catalytic converter security marked to make it harder for thieves to dispose of.
- Park your car in a locked garage where possible. If that isn't an option, park in a well lit and busy area.
- Park with your exhaust close to walls, fences or high kerbs, which will make it harder to access.
- Catalytic converters are at the front of your vehicle, so park facing walls or other vehicles where possible, which will make it harder to remove.

The Neighbourhood Policing Team meets regularly with partners to ensure we have a multi-agency approach to local issues, individuals and problem solving. These meetings are attended by local partners, including Humberside Fire and Rescue Service, Youth and Family Support, Housing Officers, Environmental Health and the East Riding Anti-Social Behaviour Team, among others. We share information and resources to deal with local neighbourhood issues, in particular, those identified as causing the most harm in the community.

High Visibility Patrols

We have been patrolling the Howdenshire areas during our shifts. We are aware that there are many vulnerable people that live within the community and we want to reassure them that we are still here for you. You have probably seen us posting on Social Media on a regular basis as a way of keeping you all updated

- Collecting and delivering prescriptions.

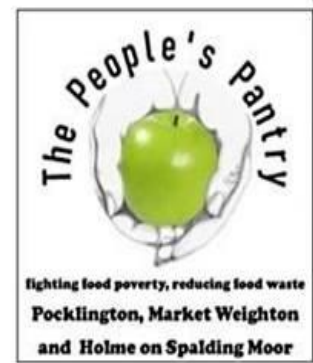
